I am currently spending 1 to 2 days per week helping to ensure that we are as efficient and effective as possible, in fulfilling the calling on all of our lives to extend God's Kingdom through FGB. I believe the Lord is calling us all as members to be led by His

After prayer, however, she started to walk and the doctor's eventually decided they could operate and give her a false hip. This they did, but also removed samples of tissue and declared there was no longer any trace of cancer or evidence that there had ever been any cancer!

A member of the Christian Motorcycle Association suffered horrendous injuries in a near fatal accident. He was not given much hope of survival, with broken bones, internal bleeding and expected brain damage. After 3 months of sustained prayer by many Christians across this nation, this man, not only recovered consciousness, but slowly over many weeks he started to move his limbs, began to speak and communicate rationally, and is even now taking a few steps unaided.

Let's give God all the glory for these miracles of healing against all the odds, in Jesus name.

sight." They were, of course, charmed to hear compliments about their child and went off with *Voice.*




