Uniting in faith for a new day

At the second FGB-BMF **Global Leadership Prayer Summit**, held in London in January 2013, God spoke to the men in many different ways through times of fellowship and sharing testimonies together, through heartfelt prayer and fasting, prophecy, thanksgiving and worship. There was a tremendous sense of joy and unity among brothers from the nations.

In essence, we heard that this really is a new day to move forward in the freedom of God . . . not living in the past, ‘remembering not the former things,’ though we nevertheless praise God for all He has done.

A God-given Vision

“It’s time for us to get our eyes off the past, prayerfully seeking God about what He wants us to do now,” said Blake Morris, National Director for FGBMF Canada. The honesty, depth and quality of the corporate prayer times were unforgettable, said another leader.

Men from many nations were

reminded that God had given us the **Full Gospel Global Forum (FGGF)** in trust, following last year’s Global Leadership Prayer Summit. This Forum is a network of like-minded national groups, helping to restore and rebuild relationships to more fully achieve God’s global Vision as given to Demos Shakarian.

In the Forum, we are “closely knit together, and loosely associated.” We were reminded that the leaders present represented 100,000 members across the nations – it was “not just about *us*, gathered here in London,” but that the Holy Spirit would use those present to help transport the message of unity in the God-given Vision, in all its variety of expressions, to countless other men, as accurately as possible.

God has given us the Full Gospel Global Forum which aims to provide a platform for networking, mutual support, encouragement and co-operation on common projects both nationally and globally. As one African leader declared: “Remember one thing, simply

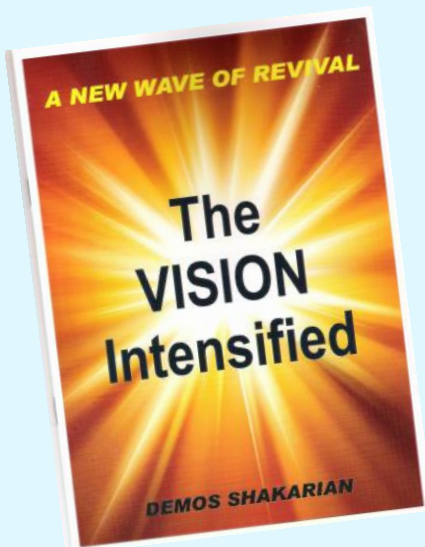

this – that the Vision we share in this global fellowship is God’s own project and nothing can stop it . . . no matter what your situation, or what you face, God sees it all . . . He knows, and He is faithful who has called you. Nothing is impossible for Him.”

We were also reminded that “God did not *give* Demos the Fellowship,” because it belongs to the Lord. Demos, a true servant-leader, knew there was so much that the Holy Spirit wanted to do to accomplish His end-time purposes.

Back in 1952, Demos was given the initial Vision as he desperately sought God’s will while praying in his living room in the early hours of a Saturday night. At that point, he had come to the end of his own exhaustive efforts . . . and then God showed him the glorious Vision of what lay ahead.



As the years went by, God gave that same revelation – to see ordinary laymen reach out with the life-giving Gospel to multitudes of others across the nations. And as Demos long ago said to Bob Bignold (who is today President of FGMB-FA): “Bob, encourage the men in the Vision.”

Aware that God had so much more to show us, Demos — towards the end of his life — wrote in *The Vision Intensified*, his last most prophetic booklet: “We haven’t seen anything yet! God’s Vision will intensify in an increasingly powerful wave of His glory!”

The Vision Intensified had been largely unread for years, but has now gained timely significance for those who cherish the original God-given Vision. Demos felt that “the Spirit seemed to say, I DO NOT WANT A BIG CENTRALISED ORGANISATION . . . I want you *small, local and sensitive to Me* . . . give me outlets for my infinite variety.”

In recent years, the Lord has again reminded us of His prophetic words to Demos because there will come a great wave of revival across the world, a vast outpouring until the earth is filled with the knowledge of the glory of God.

At the London Summit, the leaders were reminded that Demos, in his final prayer in *The Vision Intensified*, wrote: “Lord, help to FOCUS ONLY ON YOU.”

In London this year, FGB Nigerian national leader **Ifeanyi Odedo**, reminded us that there is no alternative to servant leadership, if the work is to be directed by the Holy Spirit; leaders must lay aside their pride, ambition and self-will if they have sought to raise themselves up, rather than exalting Jesus, thinking that they ‘own’ the fellowships of which they are members.

Hunger for God

There was a strong call to forgive those who have hurt us, and to repent of prayerlessness.

Hunger for God and spending time in His presence is vital if we are to see greater spiritual victories and the glory of God manifest in our meetings and in the market place. One African leader reminded us: “As men became prayerless, the enemy sought to hijack the fellowship of the nations . . . the problem is never with God, but with us. In some cases, we have trusted our bank accounts, our organisations, or our eloquence. Prayerlessness is idolatry, because it is trusting in self.”

Under the Holy Spirit’s control there is freedom, said **Rodney Radcliffe**. “We will be motivated and led to more fully recognise and understand our national preferences and cultures. We will no longer be put off by being too quiet or too loud. The Holy Spirit will enable us to fellowship in

greater unity and a more excellent way.”

In moving forward together, today’s challenge is greater than ever and we have to admit we are cast on the Lord as never before. The battle is the Lord’s.

Peter Spreckley, chairman of FGB in the UK and Ireland, reminded us of the victory of courageous King Jehoshaphat as revealed in 2 Chronicles 20. The king looked at his own limitations and then looked to the Lord as the only Source for help: “We do not know what to do, but our eyes are upon *the Lord*.”

Be encouraged!

Something happened after Jehoshaphat’s plea to the Lord. The Spirit of the Lord came on someone in the crowd — Jahaziel — who declared: “Listen, King Jehoshaphat and all who live in Judah and Jerusalem! This is what the LORD says to you: ‘Do not be afraid or discouraged because of this vast army. For the battle is not yours, but God’s. Tomorrow, march down against them . . . you will not have to fight this battle. Take up your positions; stand firm and see the deliverance the LORD will give you . . . do not be afraid; do not be discouraged. Go out to face them tomorrow, and the LORD will be with you.’” (2 Chronicles. 20:15-18).

Peter also reminded us that we need to stand firm, trusting God and thanking Him for answered prayer. And we, too, will see the deliverance of the Lord.

Outreach to the business world

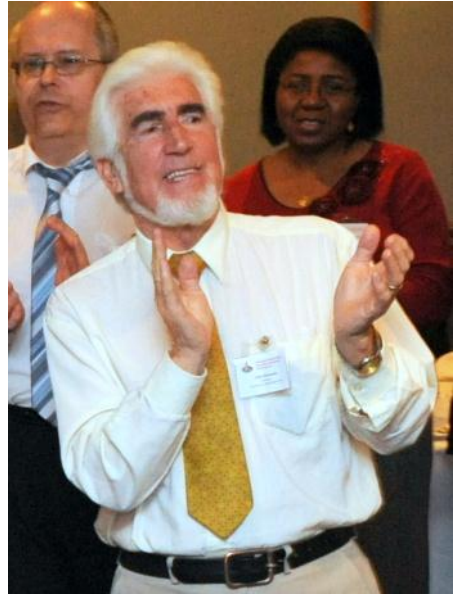
The outcome of a local prayer meeting sparks a fresh initiative in Wales with key implications for other regions.

When it comes to reaching men with the Gospel, FGB brothers in Wales are very exercised about casting their nets in the right places – not in dead places, but ‘where the fish will really bite’.

In December, four men from the **Swansea Chapter** were praying together. They included **Steve Morgan** who had a word about “casting our net in the business world” in line with the original Vision given to Demos Shakarian. Others in the local prayer meeting were Chapter President **Obi Anyadike**, **Dr Kunle Adesina**, and **John Richards**, Field Representative for South-West Wales.

Later, at a Field Reps’ meeting in **Rhyader** in February, **Clive Addison**, Wales Director, asked John Richards to share a paper he had prepared on the way the Lord was directing as He instructed His disciples to cast the net on the right side where there is an abundance of fish waiting to be caught, (*see Matt. 4: 18-22; Luke 5:4; John 21: 3-6*).

At the meeting, **Brian Morgan** (from the **Llanelli Chapter**), who has a prophetic ministry, gave a confirming word: “You have heard the detail, you have heard the ‘casting of the nets’ will vary from place to place, now hear that small voice . . . rely on the Holy Spirit . . . My net is ready to be cast.”



John Richards in jubilant mood

During a morning quite time, John Richards was also reminded in March of the word in Amos 3:7 - “Surely the Lord God does nothing unless He reveals His secret to His servants the prophets.”

John Richards, during a time of reflection, suddenly remembered a key business leader in Wales, whom he had not seen in years. This influential Christian friend now has regular contact with 7,000 small businesses. Later, John phoned him and they met in a local hotel for lunch with three other FGB men. They were greatly encouraged by the support from John’s business friend who is willing to speak at FGB outreach meetings.

Later in March, at the Wales FGB members’ breakfast meeting in **Brecon**, **Paul Saville** from the **Cardiff Chapter** prophesied after John Richards had spoken about the vision of ‘casting the nets.’ Paul

felt that that the Lord was saying: “My people, the nets are open and they are full . . . you need to reach out and bring to pass my purposes.”

Now it’s worth mentioning that John Richards is a retired Company Director, and the current Financial and Operation Director for the Council of the Christian Voluntary Sector in Wales. He is also a Cardiff City supporter (he was on their playing staff in the 1950s). Now as a lively 83-year-old he firmly believes that by God’s grace “you don’t get retired, you just get re-fired.”

Following the meeting with the business leader, the brothers in Wales are looking for a venue large enough to have a significant outreach dinner for the market place community.

“All these developments came out of a prayer meeting,” says John. This outreach is not merely a single chapter initiative, but has strategic implications for the whole region and, indeed, for other regions across the UK and Ireland.

Incidentally, John, (born in Cardiff),

has also recently made “an amazing recovery” from a cancer operation. He and his wife, **Sheila**, also passionately believe that our God is a God who heals, as Sheila, too, has had a remarkable healing lately. Sheila was told by doctors that she clearly needed an operation on her left knee. John looked for a Scripture “to stand on” and found Hebrews 12:12 which speaks about “strengthening feeble knees.”

Then a few weeks ago, after they had prayed, the surgeon ordered an X-ray and discovered that Sheila’s knee was completely healed. The operation was cancelled.

“I always look for a Scripture to stand on,” says John. “You have to believe God’s Word. You speak it out and exercise your faith, even if your faith seems small like a mustard seed. What we *say* has great power to release the power of God into our lives. We must also guard our hearts and let the peace and rest of God rule in our lives.”

John specially loves God’s promise in Exodus 23:25: “So you shall serve the Lord your God, and he will bless your bread and your water. And I will take sickness away from the midst of you.”

SIXTY REMARKABLE YEARS

This year, members and friends of the Fellowship are recalling the 60 years since the Christian businessman **Demos Shakarian** (1913-1993) founded FGBMFI in 1952.

By December 26, Demos (*pictured here*) was discouraged and ready to close the Fellowship after a faltering start — then he received an amazing God-given vision in the early hours of Saturday morning. This vision confirmed that the Fellowship should continue. It expanded rapidly and grew to become the



largest laymen’s fellowship in the world — and ultimately *millions of lives* were impacted with the Gospel. But the world in 1953 was very different from today with a population of 2.6 billion. Now it has risen to 7.1 billion. The challenges and opportunities for the Gospel are greater than ever.

In his last booklet, *The Vision Intensified*, Demos predicted a day when a new wave of end-time revival would explode among God’s people — “the Vision is not complete . . . we haven’t seen anything yet! God is seeking a prepared people to serve Him in power . . . I admonish you not to take these words lightly.”

My fantastic time with FGB in Malaysia

Clive Addison spent a month in the capital city of Kuala Lumpur

Pictured here are some of the 500 people who attended an anniversary banquet when FGB men sang their 'Happy Men's Song' - the words on the screen (see above) were in phonetic Chinese and English, so European visitors such as me could join in!

At another event, 38 people came to Christ, and another 30 asked for more information.

Yes, FGB is alive and well in Kuala Lumpur. For the past seven years, I have regularly visited my family there. In Malaysia there are around 115 Chapters, with 60 located in and around Kuala Lumpur.

There are weekly lunchtime prayer and fellowship meetings at various market place venues — for members who can find time to attend. The meetings include praise and worship with a short “workplace testimony” from the previous week, followed by a 30-minute main testimony, plus prayer ministry. Members conclude the gathering with a free take-away lunch. As well as weekly market-place meetings by local chapters, groups also join together to put on

outreach banquets. Their work is an excellent example of “fishing with new boats.” Prayer is vital and these local chapters meet *daily* for early morning prayer.

Chapters also arrange pre-meetings with local pastors who are encouraged to ask their churches to bring along non-Christians friends and relatives to the outreach

venue, such as a large Chinese restaurant. Pastors, members and guests come free. Meetings of at least 250 people are not unusual.

One recent meeting I attended was primarily for **Filipino construction workers** as well as **Filipino women** working in the domestic sector. The entire meeting was in the Bahasa Malay language which they understand. Nine pastors attended with around 30 guests each. Around 18 guests accepted Christ as their Saviour and many more asked for more information.

I also attended an outreach meeting mainly for those from an **Indian** background, such as **Tamil-speaking** people. There was a huge response—it seemed the whole room surged forward. Some 38 people made first-time decisions for Christ and others asked

for further details so they could attend a follow-up meeting — what they call an ‘After-Saved Meeting.’

Another type of outreach event took place in the Tropicana Shopping Mall, a major retail centre. FGB men hired a restaurant at lunchtime on Saturdays, Members invited friends, shoppers and store staff to hear music and testimonies.

The first time they tried this, the restaurant owner asked for 40 guaranteed places. He sold 100 meals. Local stall holders at first feared they might see their profits go down, but FGB men guaranteed they would make up any losses. Afterwards, however, the stall holders were happy because their Saturday takings had substantially *increased!*

A REVELATION OF GOD’S GLORY

FGB’s **John Wright** was sitting in the Chapel at his country home in Norfolk, feeling tired and complaining to God about this and that. Then he felt the Lord say: “Ask Me what the glory means.”

John obeyed and into his heart came a definition of God’s glory: “**G**od’s **L**ove **O**utpoured and **R**evealed in **Y**ou!”

John was instantly revived and soon on his way, sharing God’s love with others who received FGB ‘Voice’ magazines.

Farewell to two FGB champions

Two remarkable FGB brothers in the UK, **John Linden-Cook** and **George ‘Sonnie’ Gibbard**, were both promoted to glory in March this year.

Many will recall their ministries in the London area and beyond – John and Sonnie were also with us for the FGB’s 33rd anniversary in London aboard *HMS President* on the River Thames in 2010, writes **Rodney Radcliffe**.



A gifted international Bible teacher, John, *pictured left*, founded the FGB Croydon Chapter and was President at different times of both the Croydon and City of London chapters, later becoming a Field Representative for some years in South London.

For more than 40 years he ministered on the themes of spiritual deliverance and the Second Coming of Christ. He also became Minister of Norwood Fellowship and often broadcast on Premier Radio and Revelation TV, and also wrote four books, among them, *Jesus the Deliverer*.

John, who was married to Elsa, led many to the Lord through chapter and church meetings. John, 87, died peacefully in May Day Hospital Croydon. FGB men were among those attending his memorial service at Westminster Chapel in April. John was a man of vision with high standards, leadership and fruitfulness in ministry.

‘Sonnie’
Born in a caravan in 1933, George ‘Sonnie’ Gibbard, who has died aged 80,

was a true Romani Gypsy and the grandson of the famous Victorian evangelist, **Rodney ‘Gypsy’ Smith**, MBE, (1860-1947).

Sonnie, (*pictured below*) served with FGB for more than 30 years. He was converted in a caravan meeting at the age of 14 in Epping Forest. Today, there is monument there to his grandfather Gypsy Smith.

Sonnie’s famous grandad was born in a tent, never went to school yet he eventually influenced millions with the Gospel. Gypsy Smith taught himself to read and write and made over 40 overseas mission trips to the US, Australia and South Africa. He met several presidents; Queen Victoria also wrote to him.

At the end of his life, Gypsy Smith said: “I didn’t go through your colleges and seminaries. They wouldn’t have me . . . but

I have been to the feet of Jesus where the only true scholarship is learned.”



Sonnie’s youth was tough and he travelled the world as a circus performer, appearing in the feature film, *Trapeze*. He also served as a regular

soldier in Korea, Malaya, Borneo, Cyprus and Suez. He had war-wounds to prove it.

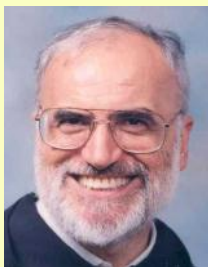
Later, with his wife Rosemary, a former teacher and civil servant, they ministered among gypsy families in Slovakia, Romania and Hungary every autumn for 25 years, working with ‘Gypsies for Christ.’ He was president of the charity from 1993-2003. (The Romani Gypsies trace their roots back 1,500 years to India).

Sonnie’s friends and associates included the late **Fred Lemon**, another well-known evangelist. In earlier years, Sonnie was President of the East London chapter of FGBMFI.

600 expected at Vichy European Convention

A LETTER TO MEMBERS FROM PETER SPRECKLEY

Dear members,

Many of you will already be aware that the National Council has previously recommended that we use an abbreviated name (FGB or Full Gospel Businessmen) with the flame logo for presentation and publicity purposes, whilst retaining the current full formal name of the Fellowship in the footer of letter-heads or somewhere on the document as FGBMFI (UK & Ireland).

The abbreviated logo (*above*) and the ‘footer’ (*below*) illustrate the recommendation for the proposed style. The move to the use of FGB as our abbreviated name does no more than reflect what we have called ourselves over the years, but also brings our public face more in line with modern culture where “snappy” names are the norm and so more acceptable.

However, at the recent National Council Meeting in early March, we considered how we should now present ourselves to the world in our formal full name. This should be in a way which reflects our calling as Full Gospel Businessmen whilst at the same time making it clear that we are no longer under the authority of Richard Shakarian and the International Office.

There was agreement between the National Directors at the meeting as to what our full formal name should be, but we want first to let you the members know what we propose before the changes are fully implemented as we value your input. Please discuss your thoughts with your National Director – we want this to be the Lord’s leading on the way forward recognised by the full membership.

We propose that the full formal name should become **Full Gospel Businessmen UK & Ireland**, with the standardised abbreviation being **FGB**. At the same time, we feel we need to recognise that we are associated with the Full Gospel Global Forum, rather than the International Office of FGBMFI, so the words **Associated with the Full Gospel Global Forum** will also appear where appropriate. The above heading and the footer, below, show you the overall effect of these proposed changes which have also been included in this issue of ‘Vision’ magazine to give a clearer idea of how they look and work.

We are looking into changing the name registered with the UK Charities Commission to “Full Gospel Businessmen UK & Ireland”, or if we are prevented from including Ireland in the registered name, then

just “Full Gospel Businessmen UK.”

However, we would still continue including Ireland in our full formal name in our publications, even if the UK Charities registered name excludes it.

Whilst the logo on all our printed matter should be the Flame logo, which we have been using for some time, we feel that if members wish to continue to wear the existing ‘International’ badge there will be no objection to them doing so, and the lapel pin badges will still be available from the National Office.

We believe that these changes, whilst streamlining the name, will nevertheless tell the world who we still are and what we are about.

Be a carrier of God's Glory

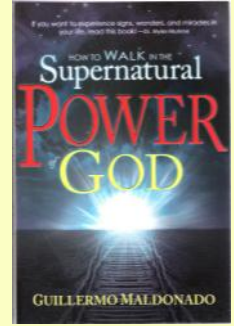
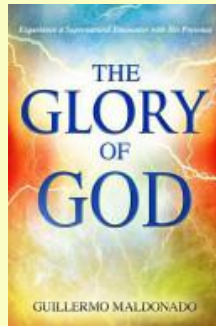
Jesus said: "And the glory which You gave Me I have given them, that they may be one, just as We are one." (John 17:22)
