At the Helsinki event there was also great encouragement for the **Women of the Fellowship.** While the men attend-




ed their own meetings, there were separate sessions available for the ladies with times allotted for personal testimo-

hospital, but is now home and planning more FGB events.



esus is Lord — and He is leading us by His Spirit in these days towards seeing His Greater Glory, as we continue as FGBMFI (UK & Ireland) to reach out and remain faithful to our calling from God and to the vision given through **Demos Shakarian**.

Please continue to use the members' resources, and particularly the **Develop**ment Plan, available from the National Office (office@fgbmfi.org.uk) or on-line through the website (www.fgbmfi.org.uk).

May I just highlight a few of the most significant recommendations from the Development Plan, as agreed by all the Directors:

- Prayer and Fasting is to be encouraged at personal, Chapter, Regional and National levels! Effective and fervent prayer is so important and is still the key to our intimate personal relationships with the Lord Jesus and the effectiveness of our Chapter outreach initiatives.
- Outreach events should be held regularly, but as led by the Holy Spirit, with flexibility, variety of venues and 'the launching of new boats', such as the use of Costa Coffee Shops in Hitchin and Halifax recently, and even street or open air outreach, such 'Healing on the Streets' (power evangelism) or the recent distribution of Voice magazines at the Grand National.

- Local Churches should be contacted personally by Chapter Officers to ensure a clear understanding of our vision and ministry, with FGB operating as an 'arm of the Church', seeking the active support of the Churches and feedback to the Churches for nurture and discipleship of new Christians.
- Members should all be encouraged to be actively involved in ministry in their respective roles: using their talents and gifts of the Spirit, witnessing and inviting guests, giving testimony and ministering/praying at outreach events.

All members should also encourage their wives and other Christian women to be fully involved in supporting the ministry of FGB and if called of God to become formal members of Women of the Fellowship.

fgbmfi.org.uk) are being continually updated in terms of presentation, content (general information and event publicity), members' resources and email communication facilities.

Greetings from our Nigerian brothers to us in Europe

There are more than 2,600 FGB chapters in Nigeria, reports **Azike Diribe**, international director.

ne of the best things that happened to us in **Nigeria** has been the sharing of the God-given FGBMFI vision in the early 1980s. A previous attempt to establish the fellowship here in the 1970s, failed. But in 1984, a group of men in the city of **Port Harcourt**, led by **Sam Mbata** caught the vision, and enthusiastically moved beyond their city to plant chapters in other Nigerian cities.

Today, there are over 2,600 chapters all over Nigeria. In almost every hotel in Nigerian cities, FGB chapters meet each week for fellowship, reaching out to other men with the love of Jesus. FGB is now the largest laymen's Christian fellowship in Nigeria, touching lives at practically every level of Nigerian life, including the palaces of over 40 traditional rulers in many parts of the nation.

Committed to the Vision

The Fellowship has also spearheaded airlift outreaches to **West**, **East and Southern African Regions**. In West Africa, Nigerian chapters have organised airlifts to Togo, Benin, Mali, Liberia, Sierra Leone, Cote D'Ivoire, Senegal and Burkina Faso. Many new chapters

have started in these nations as a result of these outreaches.

Despite the differences we are experiencing at the International Office of the Fellowship, we in Nigeria are unwavering in our commitment to the original vision of the fellowship. Daily, new chapters are springing up in Nigeria, and we see the Lord doing many mighty works among us. The future of the fellowship remains very bright in Africa

A new generation of Spirit-filled men are being raised all over Nigeria and West Africa whose vocations cover many types of business, the professions, the academia and in government We are setting new standards of integrity in our national life, that will change the outlook of our nations and give our continent a new image and respect around the world.





To Russia . . . with love

Helen and Trevor Bendrien report on their latest trip to Russia

e were excited when the invitation came to go back to Russia — we'd enjoyed our time there very much in January last year but the temperature had been minus-25C and we had not been able to look around as much as we had wanted to. This time the weather was beautiful.

We had had a stream of bad news and problems on every front while we were preparing to go and I was beginning to think that I'd done something to bring these problems upon us; should I repent? I felt as if I was praying to a metal ceiling. I came to the conclusion that this trip would be the guide to whether God had withdrawn a little or whether the enemy has attacked so much he had got me believing that I could no longer be effective.

We landed in **Moscow** and were met by Gary, for a brilliant start. It was early evening so we were whisked away in a big black car to the Kremlin, well at least to look at it. We spent some time in the Red Square area - and then off to Gary's house for food and to meet the family.

The next morning we were on a plane to **Saratov** (in the south, near Kurdistan). I spoke at a Friday night meeting, and then next in a city called **Marx** - after Karl of course, I spoke at lunch there and saw the Spirit of God working in the people.

Sunday we went to the Church for the African medical students studying in the area - another great meeting.


By now I was starting to feel more comfortable about everything and had totally forgotten what was happening at home. On Monday we had a eight-hour ride North in the back of a smallish car with guitar and bags on our knee's over roads which went from British B-road standard to dirt tracks: no motorways here, I'm afraid. Eventually we arrived in **Nizhny Novgorod**, a very picturesque city on the banks of the Volga. Here we had a terrific meeting in a Japanese restaurant; "Sushi and God," you might say. Next day we went westwards by train to Moscow, four hours, and then north to St. Petersburg, another four hours.

By now I had forgotten what day it was but had seen God do many things and we were excited to see what would come next. We were met at the station by a young man with whom we had spent a lot of time 16 months earlier. He was excited to remind us we had

prayed for him and his wife that they would have another child, as they had been trying for a long time. Their second daughter is now six months old!

We spoke at a church meeting the next night to about 150 people and had a great

time of ministry at the end with many people ministering and more being touched. The next day we were taken for lunch - and 30 minutes later we were sat with **Nicky Cruz** (whose amazing story is told in the best-selling books, *Cross and Switchblade* and *Run Baby Run*), and the producer from the TV station where I'd earlier given an interview. On the way to the dinner meeting we heard that the numbers had doubled and the restaurant 'couldn't fit everyone in'. But we all did fit in, *just!*

ere are some of the stories:

Andre, who'd invited us, had met a university friend he'd not seen for 25 years.

The friend had studied English and when he heard Andre 'was not an orthodox priest or a Jehovah's witness', he agreed to come to the meeting.

During the ministry time, Andre prayed for healing. The first word of knowledge was for someone with a problem in the back of their left hand. This old friend was the first one to go forward, since he couldn't move his left hand properly and it was very painful. Andre led him to the Lord and he was healed.

Helen and I were praying for a big Jewish man, 6ft 4ins., and Helen had a vision of a bouncing ball which was never still. Everywhere it bounced it brought joy, and implied that he would never be still. This picture meant a lot to him and was confirmation of his life travelling between Israel and Russia, but as we were finishing praying, someone handed me a bright red bouncing ball in its wrapper - the man broke into floods of tears. How did God arrange for all these things to come together, on cue ?!

The translator's wife had once worked with a colleague for three years, but hadn't seen him for another two years — yet they bumped into each other and he agreed to come to the meeting. I had a 'word' for someone with problems in the lower back and neck areas. This same man came forward and asked if the 'medium' would pray for him. So I prayed and left the 'explaining' to the translators wife!

The next day, as we travelled by car to **Helsinki**, we had a joyous phone call to report a healing. I'd had word for a man with a loose bone in the back of his neck, someone had came forward for prayer and, now, as we travelled to our next location, he was calling to say that the day before he'd come to the meeting by bus and taxi as he'd been too ill to drive. But after prayer he felt better, and the next day was totally healed, able to drive and play in the park with his son.

I came home refreshed and in the knowledge that we were still walking in the centre of God's will and with the confidence to square up to the problems I knew were facing me on my return.

From the UK to Romania . . . in a 44-ton aid truck

The first time that FGB member John Dawson went on a ministry trip to Eastern Europe, his heart was touched by the needs of the people.

So a few weeks ago, John, a member of **Northwich chapter**, set off on a 'miracle trip' in a massive truck loaded to the roof with clothing, furniture, toys, carpets, household items, food, including two tons of flour from 'Save the Children' fund — and even wheelchairs!



In answer to prayer, John, pictured here, was able to use a 'MAN' tractor unit from Glasgow and an International Aid trailer from Preston,

Lancashire. His travelling companion was **Ray Fisher**, a fellows member of Hollybush Christian Fellowship. Ray is a retired driver of concrete-mixer trucks.

The journey across Europe, via the port of Dunkerque was a battle all the way with border officials, paperwork problems, hairpin bends, potholes, carts on narrow roads...and sheer hard work.

John phoned a prayer alert back to FGB brothers in the UK to pray — and



they saw miracle breakthroughs. In Hungary, they were just waived across the border to Romania. Within six days, they were able to begin deliveries en route to the city of **Cluj**, *pictured below*, a city of 300,00 in Transylvania in northwest Romania.





On day nine, Ray fell sick on the journey home, so John spent the night in the truck outside the hospital. But by day 12, they were back home in the UK, much to
