T was the eldest son of a family of I five sons and one daughter. 'Born free' under hot African skies in Rhodesia, now Zimbabwe, My parents, devout Roman Catholics, ensured that I had a good religious education and sent me to be educated by the Jesuit's at St George's College whilst my sister attended the Dominican Convent which had as one of it's founder's a relative who came up by oxcart from the Cape in the 1890's. I was brought up to fear God and the prospect of Hell kept me on the straight and narrow.

In hindsight I had a wonderful childhood, 'Drugs' were what you found in a chemist and the word 'mugger' had not even been invented! Holidays were spent in the bush shooting anything that moved or lolling around the swimming pool. As a school boy I had early success as an all round sportsman,

despite suffering from bronchial asthma, and played 1st Team Rugby, which enhanced my popularity with the girls. Life could not have been better.

Since the day I started work I always seemed to land on my feet. Being at the right place at the right time comes to mind, however the world's values soon had me involved in 'Wine, Women and Song' and I loved to party.

Today as I reflect on my earlier years I'm intrigued at how easily I slipped into a life of sin. I had no hang ups, no abuse and yet the things I had held so dearly in my early life just ran like sand through my fingers. I had to put it down to the fact that as part of 'fallen mankind', I was inherently as corrupt as the rest. I never consciously abandoned God, I simply drifted into things which were more appealing and interesting to me. I suppose death and things eternal seem so far off when you are young.

I shudder to think where I would have gone had God taken my life away during those dark years. I can recall several occasions when I could easily have lost my life. Once on Mt Mulanje in Malawi, when I lost my way in treacherous conditions after an asthma attack, and twice while sailing in storms on Lake Malawi.

From Head to Heart

7th August 1976 was a watershed in my life. That was the day I married my lovely wife Chantal and took on a ready made family when Eric, only 4 years old became my dear stepson. Suddenly my bachelor days were over and I had new responsibilities. Arriving in Zimbabwe to bid farewell to my family, I was immediately struck by the 'glow' on my mother's face. I asked what had happened and she explained that while praying in

the kitchen she was suddenly overwhelmed by the presence of God and began to laugh and cry in ecstatic joy. She later understood that she had been filled with the Holy Spirit, just as those disciples had been on the day of Pentecost. As I quizzed her more about this I knew that I wanted to have this same experience and enjoy that same peace and thus was the beginning of my search for a real spiritual experience with God.

It happened for me some six months later in Takapuna, Auckland, New Zealand. In my quest I had joined a 'Life in the Spirit' seminar, very similar to the Alpha courses offered by churches today. For the first time I saw the manifest power of God in healing, deliverance, prophecy and discernment. I was seeing and experiencing what was written in the

book of Acts nearly 2000 years ago. It blew my mind!! In my early years as a Christian. I had a 'head' knowledge of God. but now I had spiritual revelation (a 'heart'

knowledge) and that was a massive transition from where I'd been. My verv nature was impacted and for the first time I saw and understood

clearly the love of God for me and all His creation. I can liken experience to watching the TV with the aerial unplugged when all you get is a fuzzy haze, but plug it in and you see everything crystal clear.

Formerly, as a Catholic I was in and out of the confessional like a fiddler's elbow but nothing really changed because, of myself, I was powerless to change my life. Now as a Born Again Believer it's the Holy Spirit who empowers my life and makes me strong. Sadly that's not to say that I no longer sin, but I manage my affairs more successfully and have the wisdom to keep away from those

When one doesn't have wealth, one knows it is not enough, and when one acquires wealth, one soon comes to realise it is still not enough! Living in central London, I led a rather wild lifestyle. I had a choice to make. On one side of where I lived was a casino, where I could play roulette until four in the morning, while on the other side, I could party until five in the morning. Obviously, at that time, life didn't have much meaning.

A Millionaire at 28

Economically, I was raised at the bottom of the barrel. Fortunately, I was surrounded by wealthy people. They gave me a goal in life. I used to deliver bread, wine and newspapers to wealthy people. When I went inside their homes I could see that their furniture was different than our family's. Things looked a lot better in their homes than they did in ours.

Seeing that wealth gave me an incentive in life: to make money.

A couple of times I came home and my mother was crying because we did not have any food to eat. That was pretty basic, but it was a motivation for me to make money. I'm not advising that as a management strategy, but it motivated me. I didn't know why I wanted to make money; it was like a blind ambition. It quickly became obvious that as an employee, I could not make any real money. So, at age 24, I went out on my own and started a real estate business.

My motto was that there is no point in going to work unless you are going to make money. To network with people, I would do anything to meet people. It was a seven-day-a-week job. I became quite successful through entertaining, networking, whisky, wine and luck. By the age of twenty-eight I had made several

million pounds, and was making more and more money.

On my wedding day. I went to confession, but I didn't have time to confess all of my sins. After only ten vears of marriage, my wife announced that she wanted

a divorce. It was quite a blow! Immediately I moved out of my estate. and SO poured myself into my ambition and work: making money.

China was beginning to open up to business, so I went through that door of opportunity. I still have businesses in England. Europe, China, the Far East and Hong Kong, from real estate to technology firms.

A few months later he asked me out to dinner. We went to the west part of London to get one of the best curries in town. In spite of the run-down area, we parked his Rolls Rovce outside the building.

Shortly thereafter, the pretty girl that ushered us into the Salvation Army building, along with two other men, came into my office. She exclaimed to me. "You need Jesus Christ!"

My quick reply was, "I don't need Iesus Christ. I am a businessman.

One night I was walking near Berkeley Square and I wanted a cigarette and a cup of coffee. I wasn't really going anywhere, so I sat down at a coffee shop. A great big man in the corner, who I vaguely recognised. shouted to me and asked me if I had had a hard day. My response, 'Yeah, a hard life, as well!' He was a very famous London photographer. I helped him to settle a business dispute he had; and we became friends.

There comes a point where you say, "Look, there are a lot of promises in the Bible. If it is not true and He is a liar, then we are all wasting our time, aren't we?" But you must stand on the Word of God. There is total peace and joy. God does miracles. I've even had money miraculously arrive in my bank account, with absolutely no idea where it came from!


A Complete Way of Life


have a very sentimental attachment to the FGBMFI. It's a fantastic organisation!

When the Holy Spirit got hold of me I became involved in visiting those in prison and helping the homeless. Most Saturday mornings at 6 a.m. I have a 'soup run', helping about a hundred homeless people. Maybe I should have gone to prison for some of the things I've done in my life, and I have a heart for the underdog, the guy that's had the unlucky break. There is just a hairline difference between a crooked businessman on the outside of prison, and the convicted criminal on the inside.

I see a lot of miracles on the streets on Saturday mornings. I now know the true value of a pound. These homeless guys on the streets literally have nothing. Most don't have any hope, but when I start talking about Jesus, there is a new hope in their lives. You can buy two cups of coffee for one pound in London. That is a very valuable pound to someone who is on the streets, particularly on a November or December morning. Maybe that homeless person has slept on the street all night.

There's more to life than just wanting to make money.

Background

I was born into a happy, secure, loving, church-going family. Having been confirmed at the age of 14, I continued going to church throughout my teenage years. I had a privileged education but failed to make the most of it, and took a mechanical engineering apprenticeship.

Soon into Business

At the age of 23 I left engineering and borrowed enough money to buy a run-down working men's café at New Eltham. My fulfilment lay in providing good food, hard work, meeting people and saving money. I just assumed that I was a Christian and remained a regular pew-filler, but went to sleep during sermons!

I then sold the café and made enough money to buy and stock a small shop in Margate – Clive Menswear. It quickly became a success and I found it a very enjoyable and creative business, and it provided me with all the trappings of a large house and two cars. My church-going habit declined during these years. A series of break-ins at the shop – twenty-five in thirteen

years – plus one armed hold-up for good measure, seemed to show me that I was surrounded by evil. I had to 'seek the light' and I knew that that was in church. I was then invited to an evangelical meeting and the Minister stopped the singing to boldly say: "The Lord says there is

someone here He does not want to lose, would they step forward, the Lord wants to bless him." A voice in my head said: "It's not you," and

another one said: "It is you, go forward." I remained in my seat but I was challenged and had a sleepless night. I was made aware of my sins, acutely realising through terrible visions that I was existing without God, but through all this Jesus was calling me.

A Personal Relationship

As a result of this I made what I thought was a recommitment to the Lord Jesus Christ, but over a period of eighteen months I came to realise that I had no personal relationship with Him, and concluded that I was not saved. Alone on my knees

I repented, asked Jesus to forgive my sins and become my saviour. There was a wonderful release and tears of joy followed.

After this came a time of cleansing and gentle prompting by the Holy Spirit. I was aware of my inability to speak or be a helper for the Lord, and whilst on my own I asked Him to fill me with His Holy Spirit. I experienced a mighty infilling of love, peace and joy. Later I sought

Into The Ark

Still a bachelor. I was burdened to work for the Lord, who had done great things for me. My church group leader said that I would be good running a Christian bookshop. The idea seemed very dull after running a glitzy fashion business. But I sold the business and spent six months telling the Lord that I would do anything other than running a bookshop – until I heard Him say: "Do it for me." Then, whilst looking for a suitable shop, I met a pastor and Fellowship that had had the vision of just such a shop for eleven vears. A shop was bought and The Ark Christian Centre in Erith, Kent was opened. It sold books, music and

it was our joy to see many spoken to, prayed for, counselled and generally ministered to – our vision was to show God's love to the community.

Nothing is Impossible with God

After serving in The Ark for eight years, the Centre became a registered charity, and the mortgage of £48,000 was amazingly paid off through large

donations and I was offered a rest.

I turned my attention to neglected property business affairs at this time, and it was then that I was

introduced to the Full Gospel Business Men's Fellowship International. Eighteen months after this my mother, who was a Christian, had a severe stroke and in the intervening three and a half years before she died I met Henrietta. I fell in love with and married this super Christian lady, and she has been a great help to me and my best present ever!

I also believe in healing and miracles. My father at the age of 79 was diagnosed with two inoperable brain tumours with only weeks to live.

Together with my mother and two friends I prayed against the tumours for three weeks before the next scan. When the scan was taken the specialist was

amazed that he could not find the tumours at all! We praised Jesus and knew throughout that God was greater. My father continued in good health until he was called to heaven. Nothing is impossible with God!
