Over Easter, FGB member **Bob Humphries**, *below right*, and his wife **Linda**, (pastoral leaders of the Kadesh Drop-in Centre, in Norwich tel 0772 926 3650) met a couple of good friends in the paint aisle at the B & Q superstore. The lady asked for prayer for her husband

who was unwell, so right there in the paint aisle Bob prayed: "Lord, we pull heaven down on us!"



The following Sunday, the couple came to the Norfolk church that

Bob helps to pastor, and the lady stood to testify to *her* healing after a lifetime of memory-blocks, following a painful childhood. In the night, after the prayer at B&Q, God brought back to her good memories and gave her release over difficult experiences recalled from early life.

Transformation

A few weeks ago, a 20-year-old man from **London** who was **a** new Christian, was also bothered by his past and longed for his life to be cleaned up. So he travelled over 100 miles to meet Bob and Linda for prayer at the **Kadesh Centre**, 100 miles away in Norfolk.

At the Centre, after a prayer of deliverance, the young man leapt with joy, declaring he was totally free. Within two days he was baptised at his London church — and his family says he is "completely changed."

Elsewhere, FGB member and evangelist **Des Pilling** from **Wigan** prayed for a 17-year-old girl who had been blind in one eye from birth. She was among a group of teenagers attending a tent meeting where Des was ministering.

Des, right, admits he only went to the FGB dinner for a free meal, but it changed his life



As Des Pilling laid hands on the young lady's blind eye, she began to cry as blurred vision first appeared, followed by full sight. Her young friends were in awe and many surrendered their lives to Christ.

Des Pilling's own story is something of a miracle: as the son of a miner, he was invited to an FGB meeting at the age of 21 but "only went for the free meal – but I quickly realised that God was there!"

Later, he wept his way to the Cross and within two years felt called by God to be an evangelist.


prayer and then fell in the power of the Holy Spirit.

The healing power of forgiveness

At the most recent FGBMFI directors' meeting, there was a recurring picture of *drops of rain falling on hard ground.* "Each drop is very small, but each one spreads out, and as they do so, so the water is very gradually being absorbed into the hard ground which is becoming softer."

"The key for us is forgiveness. When we forgive, it releases God's rain, softening us. We need to be softened like clay, so it can be moulded. Then as soft soil, it is also good soil for the seed to germinate.

"Lord, help us to forgive, so that we may be softened and moulded—help us to be obedient to that rain of your Spirit."

As someone has said, the true level of our faith is measured by the level of our forgiveness, as both are directly linked.

him to be being obedient and resigning from the family business to serve the Lord Jesus Christ more fully.

Later, Hugh heard about some local men who wanted to start an FGB chapter. Hugh went to their first meeting and was promptly elected vice-president of the **Uckfield Chapter** (East Sussex), for 12 years, then president for seven years.

In all, Hugh has so far achieved 24 years service with FGBMFI and is still going strong. Paul Blakey honoured by the Queen

Halifax FGB member **Paul Blakey**, founder of **Street Angels**, has received an MBE at Buckingham Palace, for services to community safety.

Paul, aged 35, founded Street Angels in 2005 – "it was an idea from God, born out of the Full Gospel's youth outreach in Halifax on a Saturday night in 2004," he says. The vision was prompted by the needs of large numbers of young men and women on the streets.

Now Street Angels have spread to many towns in the UK, with inquiries coming in from Europe, Brazil, America and even China.

Crime has fallen

Even the police admit that crime has fallen significantly in areas where the Street Angels operate. The pioneering project began in Halifax as a ministry of Churches Together in Halifax and the local YMCA. The initiative provides a safe place for people on the streets on Friday and Saturday between 9pm and 3am.

Based at a safe place, the Fairtrade Café, the volunteer-based project sees Street Angels visiting the streets of the town-centre looking out for people who have become vulnerable. They offer help and assistance, from directing lost people to hotels or coaches to calling for medical assistance to those who have had drinks spiked or become ill.





The promised 'Greater Glory'

Do you believe that FGBMFI is in decline? Or have you seen signs of the 'Greater Glory'

promised through several independent prophetic words spoken over the Fellowship in recent years? Well, be encouraged – God is definitely at work through FGBMFI!

He is still anointing the Vision towards fulfilment in these latter days. God's Kingdom is being extended!

Recent reports from other nations, particularly in South America and Africa, of what God is doing through FGB, are truly exciting. Literally thousands of people committing their lives to Christ and hundreds of new FGB Chapters being formed in the last year in Nigeria, is just one example.

But what about here in the UK & Ireland? Some Chapters are indeed struggling to hold regular effective outreach meetings — with membership ageing and declining. However, we do have a **Development Plan** (recently updated on the website: www.fgbmfi.org.uk), which emphasises the need for regular prayer towards Spirit-led outreach. This means launching 'new boats' under God's direction to effectively reach men and women from different areas of society, young

Terry is the new SE regional director

Terry Lowe (right) who lives in Walderslade, Kent, became the FGBMFI regional director for the South-East in February this year.

He first became a member of the Dartford Fellowship in 1988 after hearing the remarkable testimony of **Noel Fellowes**, a young ex-police constable wrongly convicted of murder, who finally received a royal pardon. (His story is told in the book, *Killing Time*).

Terry, the eldest of nine children, born into a poor family in 1935, also has a story of considerable pain, as regards affairs of the heart.

Engineering degree

During more than 12 years' service with the Royal Engineers, he saw success as a military Clerk of Works and gained an honours degree in engineering. He also escaped unhurt on many occasions — once, when he and his young family were injured in a very serious road accident after a large Rover car ran into their hired vehicle in 1961 — and a few years later in 1967 when a hand-grenade was hurled into the door of their hangar in South Arabia.

Terry first married in 1955, just weeks after he joined the army but it ended in divorce after more than 18 years and the gift of six children. Although professionally he was successful as a senior lecturer in a technical college with letters after his name, "it counted for nothing," he says.

At the age of 40, he married his lovely new wife **Anne** in 1975.

Later, a trainee doctor friend, aware o f Terry's hurts were that emerging again after nine vears into his second marriage, gently told Terry that "God is the



only person who will never let you down." And Terry also knew instinctively that his friend spoke the truth.

Eventually, Terry did pray the Lord's prayer which he remembered from schooldays. But nothing seemed to happen. Finally, as though complaining, he asked God for a sign. Then, the next morning in a shop (which he ran as a hobby on his time off from college) he fought with a gunman who was later caught through TV's *Crime Watch*, along with his gang.

Eventually, while on holiday in the US with Anne, then pregnant with **Stephanie**, they were invited by his eldest daughter, **Susan**, then 30, to attend a large church. Susan and her husband's own lives had been transformed there in the US through faith in Christ, two years before.

The greatest miracle

When the invitation was given, Terry went to the altar with his daughter, and found the greatest miracle – salvation through Jesus Christ. He realised that God had already revealed his reality by delivering him during the armed robbery. "Susan's scripture references on oaths also persuaded me to give up freemasonry," he adds. "And Stephanie had a brand new father, two months before she was born in October, 1986."

where he pioneered a chapter with **Bob Boler** (now FGB Office Co-ordinator) and **Colin Pownall**, who today is a prison chaplain and also chaplain to the **Christian Motorcyclists' Association.**

Eventually, Peter made ministry trips with others to **Romania** were there was "fantastic blessing" as they prayed with men and women in prison and saw God's healing and restoring power. One observer said it "was like a bomb going off, because the men of God had been there."

Today, Peter is full of praise for Kathleen who gave up a promising career in accountancy to bring up their large family. Peter works as a Project Manager in the water industry and would like to have more time for God's work, but his company won't let him go yet.

There are 16 chapters in Peter's region – and the 17th is about to start at the Auctioneer's Restaurant in **Carlisle** on May 7. Peter succeeds **Stuart Cripps** as regional director, (while Stuart remains the National Executive Officer). Meanwhile, Peter's vision is to see a chapter born in every town of 10,000 or more. But he knows there is a spiritual cost – "I'm passionate about surrender . . . about trusting God with all our hearts. None of us can do His work in our own strength. We must let the Holy Spirit lead us."



Dr ORAL ROBERTS: MAN OF FAITH

Oral Roberts, the famous healing evangelist, who has recently been promoted to Glory at the age of 91, played a pivotal role in the early days of FGBMFI.

and the speaker at the world's first FGBMFI breakfast meeting. Without his personal encouragement, the Fellowship may never have expanded as it did.

He was a bold visionary. Prominent Christian leaders, including **Dr Billy Graham** (also 91), **Rev Jack Hayford** and **Pastor Benny Hinn** have heaped praise on him, describing Oral as "a man of God" and "a great hero of the faith". Oral, who also founded the largest charismatic university in the world, was joyful to the end, full of faith and trust in Jesus.

Peter is the new NW regional director

Chartered civil engineer and project manager **Peter Hunt** (above) is the new director of the North-West Region which covers an area of seven million people living in Cumbria, Lancashire, Merseyside, Greater Manchester, Cheshire and the Isle of Man.

Born into a good Catholic family in Halifax on a snowy day in 1953, Peter was educated in Manchester and at Bradford University where, at 18, he first met **Kathleen**, who would eventually become his devoted wife.

Tragically, Peter's dad, **Frank**, died in a road accident at 49 when Peter was only 19 – and his mum, **Anne**, died of cancer less than three years later, a week before Peter was due to take his final exams in 1975.

Bravely, his mum had kept the news of her serious illness from Peter so he could press on with his studies.

Peter went on to study for a PhD in marine dynamics. He recalls: "I was also seeking God at that time. I was a believer in my head, but not in my heart." Meanwhile, Kathleen "had been praying for a

man of God to come into her life," and thought it would be good to invite Peter, then 25, to a day of spiritual renewal in Manchester.

It was a vital step in his redemptive journey. "The light came on, spiritually, as the speaker revealed the reality of Jesus and a life in the Holy Spirit."

Three weeks later, Peter proposed to Kathleen, who happily said 'yes'. They wondered if God would one day give them a large family – "perhaps even a football team of eleven!" – and as it turned out, they do have "six wonderful children (four boys, two girls), and five other children in heaven, due to miscarriages – making eleven children in all!

It was in 1983, during a Life in the Spirit seminar, where Peter and Kathleen were both baptised in the Holy Spirit, just seven days before their second son was born.

A book about 'the happiest people on earth'

Peter was later diagnosed with sarcoidosis, an illness that inflames the lymph nodes which can affect every organ of the body. But while convalescing, his mum-in-law found a copy of a book, *The Happiest People on Earth*, in a charity shop on the Isle of White.

"It was a brilliant book about the Full Gospel Business Men," recalls Peter, who later, at the age of 37 found his way into an FGBMFI prayer and praise event in Carlisle – "it was so welcoming, just like a family reunion." He soon found himself elected as chapter secretary

Peter's work took him to Warrington, where he was chapter treasurer, and then on to Northwich, Cheshire,
