Lives impacted and recharged

A BIG THANK-YOU to so many who sent in testimonies, encouraging reports and pictures from the various recent conventions, especially the UK gathering where the theme was **‘Reaping the Harvest.’**

Space does not allow us to use all this helpful material in one issue of **Vision**, but we hope to use extra items in forthcoming online newsletters.

Alan Davies wrote to say that when he looked over his notes from Nottingham, “I realised that they mirrored exactly the theme that Demos shared with the Fellowship in the prophetic booklet, *The Vision Intensified*.

“Over the weekend, I believe God was reiterating that same message about our participation in reaping the harvest through global gospel proclamation to transform the lives of ‘the walking dead’, and also the need to prepare diligently to partner with Him when He sends great signs, great wonders and great miracles upon the earth . . . meanwhile, people are *waiting for us* to turn up with the good news.

“For me, the overriding message of the UK Convention was *to be obedient* to the Father’s will in *doing* and saying all that He commands. He has given us the Great Commission . . . and I believe He will only choose humble, faithful, trusting, obedient, surrendered vessels . . . so my encouragement is to re-visit and re-read *The Vision*

Intensified and let the Holy Spirit speak to you afresh.”

Andy Parker sent us some great quotes by speakers at the UK Convention. Here are a few by **Graham Jones**, who told of unexpected and remarkable ways God worked during ministry trips in France, India and the US. “When you got baptised in the Holy Spirit, you lost the right to live a ‘normal’ life! When Adam and Eve were tempted by the snake, he offered them ‘wisdom’. We try to be clever sometimes - and miss out on God’s purposes.

“We musn’t get seduced by the serpent and lose our simplicity. We need to pray and sing in tongues. When we hear God and obey, walls come down. God wants to see the church living as if the Bible is true - to see us ‘get out of the box.’ We need to risk looking foolish. When you receive a prophetic word, ask God how to act on it. A crippling fear of failure is spelt P.R.I.D.E.”

Allan Jones of BMF shared about his work in Kenya: they have seen many people saved and healed and many BMF chapters have been started. One focus of the ministry is football, forming teams and sharing the gospel with players and spectators. Allan has spoken in Police Stations, at petrol stations, outside tea plantations, on death row in prisons, and at boys’ schools.

Drug addicts and alcoholics have been given new hope - BMF members are setting up rooms with large flat-screen TVs so that men can gather to watch the English Premiership - and then hear about Jesus after the match!

While the greatest miracle of all is salvation, Allan shared testimonies of many healings, including a woman with a burned

hand who was healed after being anointed with 3-in-1 oil!

For sceptical people at meetings, Allan shows photos of many individuals whom God has healed through the ministry . . . people delivered, for example, from Parkinson's disease, a brain tumour, HIV Aids, stomach cancer, a need for new knee caps and even a man fully healed after his skull had been split open.

Tony Gardiner spoke for many at the UK Convention when he said: "We had a wonderful time . . . we saw many miracles of healing and deliverance . . . even FGB men can get cast down at times and need a revival, that's why the National Convention is so important as God raises up 'the broken reed and the hands that hang down' so that we are once again waving in the breeze of praise and worship."

Reflecting on this year's UK Convention, Stuart Cripps, FGB Executive Officer, said the theme of "Reaping the Harvest" was powerfully taken up by both the main speakers with prophetic confirmation of

their messages through the body of FGB members present.

"Being led by the Spirit, hearing and trusting in God's Word, and taking the Good News of the Gospel to all nations, was the message repeated several times in different ways throughout the convention," added Stuart.

Both Graham Jones and Allan Jones (no relation apart from being in the family of God), not only taught from the Word of God, but illustrated their messages with amazing testimonies of how God had worked through them, and went on to demonstrate the power of God released through the gifts of the Spirit: words of knowledge, healings and prophetic utterance.

Plans for a united Good News Gathering at Bangor Cathedral

FGB members are being led to “launch out with new boats” in evangelism, reports Clive Addison, regional director.

The Swansea and Llanelli chapters are joining forces to arrange a Business Outreach Banquet in early February, 2014.

The speaker will be the Chief Executive the Small Business Federation, who is also a committed Christian.

Members of the Federation in South and South West Wales are receiving an invitation.

Meanwhile, in the north of Wales, the

They have been successful in negotiating to use Bangor Cathedral as a venue - the significance of this is that it is the only large venue in north and north-west Wales, which, as a building, pre-dates the different denominations.

The book tells the story of Halifax Street Angels, which was launched in 2005, and the expansion and joining together of projects across the UK and Europe under the banner of 'Christian Nightlife Initiatives Network' (CNI). Paul Blakey, founder of Halifax Street Angels and CNI Network, tells of experiences from more than 30 projects and shows how the volunteer-led initiative is contributing to reduced crime and changing people and communities. In the Foreword, the Bishop of Pontefract, Rt. Rev. Tony Robinson, says: "Much of

the news we hear about night life in our towns and cities is about unsocial behaviour and violence. So it is heartening to be able to read this story which, though not in any way diminishing the impact of harsh realities, tells of faith, hope and love."

ALL-IRELAND CONVENTION

Challenge to live 'outside the box'

Delegates sensed the renewing presence of God at the recent All-Ireland Convention, not only through the challenging ministry of speakers and times of praise and worship, led by the Bendrien 'Power Praise Band,' but in other unexpected ways.

For example, as national director **John Gates** was busily overseeing the CD recordings on the last night, he noticed a young Russian lady, an Orthodox believer in her 30s, standing tearfully at the door. She had been invited along by her father-in-law.

Fortunately, a BMF leader's wife was soon on hand to pray for the distressed Russian visitor who was later powerfully touched by God - so much so, that many around her were rejoicing by her new-found joy and freedom in Jesus Christ..

In the main sessions of the convention at Dundalk, the depth of teaching from Canadians **Paul and Shirley Abraham**, "backed up by the most amazing stories of the work of God, was a challenge to us all," reports **Terry Waters**.

The Convention began on the Thursday evening with John Abraham, *pictured here*, showing from the Scriptures how apparent delays for believers are often "not wasted time but preparation for the work God has for us."



In later sessions, John, who has the heart of an evangelist, highlighted the abundance that is



ours through Christ, "and the need to be passionate in our desire to know Him better, living the anointing of God, under an open heaven." On the Saturday of the Convention, prominent speaker **Paul Scanlon** from Abundant Life Church, (ALC), Bradford, spoke of his journey as a pastor, especially of the time when they were outwardly successful with 600 middle-class members, with good times of worship, great messages, but not really touching the local community.

There is a need in every Christian group "for a heart for the lost . . . and the need to connect with people without bring judgmental, but having an enlargement of love." So his church took the bold step to "step outside the box" and begin to bus people in from deprived areas of the city.

This change of culture was one that many members could not cope with - half the congregation left amidst of a costly building programme.

Eventually, the church saw massive growth. By 2003, the church exceeded 2,000 people and by 2006 it reached 2,800, impacting many through the local ministries, establishing a leadership academy, the LIFE Church Network and becoming a resource centre through conference, music and TV ministries.

Belgium reflections

*UK FGB members Tony and Jean Gardiner (pictured here) attended the **Belgium European Convention** which this year took place two weeks after the UK National Convention.*

After a very tiring journey from England, Tony and Jean found themselves in an overflow gathering in Belgium - a nation that is close to their hearts since Tony was instrumental in leading the Belgium director, **Rik van Neste**, to the Lord, 25 years ago. They have been visiting Belgium two or three times a year since then.

During the Convention at Blankenburg, Tony and Jean (pictured above) were soon revived from their long journey and specially impacted by the ministry of **John Arnott** from Toronto, Canada, who spoke powerfully on the Father-heart of God and our need to know more of the compassion of Jesus . . . and importance of sharing this with others.

Time may be shorter than we think to demonstrate the Father's love, grace and



forgiveness. There are signs in the Scriptures that world-shaking events could be on the horizon in 2014 and 2015.

The Bible speaks (in Acts 2:20 and elsewhere) of the prophetic significance of rare 'red moons' - and we know that most unusually four 'blood-red' total lunar eclipses will fall on the Jewish feast days of Passover and Sukkot (Tabernacles) in **2014** and **2015**, the same back-to-back occurrences at the time of 1948 (the year Israel was born as a modern state) and 1967 (the year of the Six Day War after which Israel regained control of Jerusalem).

Remarkably, in 2014 and 2015 these rare eclipses will again coincide with same Jewish feast days.

No-one can predict what may happen (and sceptics may dismiss these predicted rare events as mere mumbo-jumbo), but nevertheless, all believers should "redeem the time," seeking the Lord with fresh determination - and living lives that reflect the Father heart of God.

QUOTABLE QUOTE: John Stott on evangelism

"If we are not taking a part in Christian witness, we are not just ineffective; we are positively in revolt against Christ.

"It is sheer hypocrisy to pay lip service to the Lordship of Jesus if we do not heed His command to evangelize.

"A dumb Christian is a disobedient Christian. A Church not engaged in mission is guilty of apostasy."



Man of influence: John Stott (1921-2011) was an outstanding Christian

leader and writer of more than 50 books of which 'Basic Christianity' was among the most widely distributed around the world.

He was one of the principal authors of the Lau-

sanne Covenant in 1974 which was a manifesto by Christian leaders from 150 nations to promote worldwide evangelism. A life-long Anglican, he was also a Chaplain to the Queen.

In 2005, Time magazine ranked him among the 100 most influential people in the world. He was first drawn to faith in Christ after hearing a Gospel message at Rugby School in 1938.

How to get the word out about FGB events in your area

“We need all our outreach events to be listed on the national website,” says Stuart Cripps, Chief Executive Officer.

Did you know that when many people, who are new to FGB, look at our UK website, they mainly want to find out what is going on in their local areas?

This is the key question on guest visitors’ minds: “Where is the nearest FGB event in my area?”

They then access the Regions and Chapters pages but often find little relevant information and finish up using the ‘**Contact us**’ page to ask the FGB Office.

However, the FGB website allows us to easily enter all our upcoming outreach events - giving a golden opportunity for FGB Chapter Officers, such as the Chapter Secretary and/or the Chapter President, to better publicise coming events in their area and to give useful general information about the Chapter on their Chap-



ter page. It is very simple to do this. Chapter Secretaries and Presidents can **Create Content** on the website, giving information about coming outreach events such as dinners, lunches and breakfasts and also add general information on their own Chapter page.

Here’s how:

First, enter the website – just put the new, shorter website name (www.FGBUK.org) into your browser or Google and, in seconds, you reach our website.

You can also still use the older, longer name of www.fgbmfi.org.uk which will reach the same site (which, incidentally, is about to be enhanced and upgraded, since all effective websites undergo development from time to time).

So, having reached the FGB website, you (and all guest visitors) have easy access to all manner of information via the menu on the left-hand side. This offers information about the Fellowship, how

to contact us, and topics such as the **Happiest People on Earth, Real Life Stories, Regions and Chapters, membership, video 'collections'** – such as **'Brief Encounters' and testimonies of men in business**, and, of course, details of **Voice** magazine. A list of upcoming events also appears on the right hand panel of the website.

As an FGB member, you can go further with access to FGB **resources** and the **online shop** (the resources include a great library of teaching videos from FGB Advances and Conventions, as well as FGB guides and literature). You simply log on with your **user name** and **password** – if you, as a member, have any worries about this, just call the FGB Office, and **Clare Wilkinson** will be happy advise you on how to log on.

Having logged-on, authorised Chapter Officers (such as Secretaries, Presidents and Regional Directors) can go further and also **Create Content** (click just below the sign-in area) and get the list of options,

such as **'Events', 'Real Life Stories'** and so on.

If you don't know how to enter an event or the Chapter page general information, take a look (for example) at the entry for the Warrington Chapter. For an event, you enter the **date, time, title** of the event, and any other basic details you want to share or attach a JPEG picture version of your meeting advertisement. Then you press **'submit'** and this information goes to the FGB website moderator before it goes 'live.' Incidentally, Clare also mentions that for particularly FGB Breakfast events, please remember to set the correct start time.

"We do need all our events to be listed, and linked to the Chapter and Region, to be effective in providing the information that interested members of the public want to see as they access the **Regions & Chapters** page, with the **map of the Regions** and list of associated Chapters and their upcoming events!" says **Stuart Cripps**, our UK National Executive Officer.

For example, in Norwich the Chapter was very encouraged to welcome first-time visitors who came to hear the testimony of Catholic charismatic speaker and author, Charles Whitehead, a layman who has been the friend of three Popes.

The Chapter also held a VIP Dinner this autumn which attracted 60 community leaders among the 90 guests. They included the Lord Mayor, the chairmen of local councils and other people of influence. The event was held under the CTI banner (County Towns

Initiative). There were two main testimonies, one a leading political activist (who did not speak about politics!) and a former gang-land leader whose life has been transformed by the power of Christ.

Men on the move

A number of FGB men in the UK have been ministering in far-flung places in recent weeks.

London director **Jacob John** was invited to speak at the Nigerian Regional Convention in the city of Uyo in Akwa Ibom State, in south-eastern area of the country. Later, during the two-week tour, he also spoke at Nigerian FGB and

“market place meetings” in the cities of Port Harcourt, Lagos, Ibadan, Kaduna and Abuja. Jacob sensed the leading of the Holy Spirit from start to finish with a release of visions, prophecies, blessings and healings for about 9,000 people in total . . . “It was truly a life changing experience for me,” says Jacob.

Meanwhile, **Terry Lowe**, South-East regional director, spoke at two churches in Johannesburg, South Africa, in early December.
