being restored from times of captivity. We, too, must become 'prisoners of hope, prisoners of the Gospel and the purposes of God' – men of destiny whom God is recharging for a last great harvest 'push' in these endtimes.

God has predestined us to be partners with Him to see His will done and His kingdom come – as we obey Him, 'we become the happiest people of earth, just as Demos Shakarian discovered in his own prophetic ministry.'

The Lord wants to anoint us afresh to flow in the 'river of God.' He does extraordinary things through quite ordinary people, for we have this treasure – the Holy Spirit's Presence – in earthen vessels. 'None of us has

the excuse for not being filled with the fullness of God,' said Rick.

He recalled how — in the US, **Demos Shakarian** (1913-1993), a humble Christian businessman of Armenian origin — was bold enough to take a few steps of faith after receiving a prophetic vision in his living room. From this, FGBMFI was born worldwide.

Impact of the Fellowship

He added that FGB has probably done more to bring revival to the church at large than any other laymen's movement in the last 50 years. 'Today, so many ministries and fellowships can trace their origin back to FGBMFI.'

God has a prophetic vision for all of us, said Rick, who urged everyone, young and not so young, to lay their lives upon the altar. 'Remember, Moses didn't get started till his '80s.'

had been struck down with a debilitating illness for 14 years, following a visit to India. He suffered from chronic fatigue through ME (Myalgic Encephalomyelitis), following a serious bout of hepatitis.

For years, Alan could hardly get out of bed. Then, an Indian pastor in Bangalore, **John Francis**, said he believed Alan would be healed if he came to back to India — a land he loves - to attend a great healing service led by the evangelist **Benny Hinn** in January, 2005.

More than seven million people attended those historic meetings – and Alan and his wife, **Ann**, were on the front row. Alan was healed "and is now as strong as anything," says Ann, joyfully.

So Alan's return to Killarney as worship leader was a double opportunity for thanksgiving.



How many unusual opportunities can you report for distributing Voice magazines? One of the most recent was aboard the Eurostar Channel Tunnel train, where international director John Wright, en route to the **FGB Convention in Belgium,** discovered a 'captive audience' seated in cars with nothing much to do but read the latest **Voice** magazine. Other 'captives' just stood in long queues for the loo – where they, too, were given an opportunity to receive a copy of **Voice**.

Dozens of 'Chunnel' travellers had been given complimentary rail tickets because stormy weather in the Channel prevented a normal ferry crossing.

Incidentally, John also found wonderful opportunities to give away **Voice** magazines in France, recently. At the **French National Convention** at Vichy, they were given a word from the Lord that in His sight going out of your house without a **Voice** magazine was the same as going out `sans pantalons' (i.e. without trousers).

Rick reminded us that a major problem with God's people in the Bible is that they did not really listen to the Lord, or wait upon Him for new strength. In a prophetic act, Rick asked all delegates in the first meeting to seek

God for His vision for their lives, 'for where there is no vision, the people perish'.

As the worship team played the song, Holy And Anointed One, it was a profound moment as everyone in the first meeting on the Friday night was asked to quietly move to the four walls of the convention hall, to wait on God and seek His will. Later, as we re-assembled. Rick brought personal words of prophetic encouragement to a number of men and women in the hall.

In their 35 years of ministry, Rick and Kathy Gillis have led many teaching courses called 'School of the Spirit'. Those of us at the Telford Convention were encouraged to pray prophetically, one-on-one and also to gather in what some call 'prophetic wheels' - these are small circles of friends who wait upon God for words of encouragement for one person standing in the centre of the circle. Many of the groups found this an exhiliarating and affirming exercise.

Enlarging our vision

Vital factors in starting chapters

Speaking at the National Convention, Midlands director **Tom Bramble**, unstoppable at 86 yearsyoung, declared: 'I have a vision for 20 chapters in our region. We *had* 12, now we have 15, with calls coming in from men who want to start new chapters in areas such as Nottingham and Bridgenorth.'

Tom added: 'I want to encourage you all to reach out – because when you really give your heart to God, you can't retire from His kingdom. I like to

quote that classic film with Errol Flynn: it was called *They Died with Their Boots On.* We should never retreat. Ask the Lord to "enlarge the place of your tent" – as it says in Isaiah 54:2. We have nowhere reached the full potential of this Fellowship.'

After the Convention, we asked Tom for more thoughts on planting chapters.

God knows our hearts

Wise words — from Proverbs 24: 10-12 (Message Version):

' If you fall to pieces in a crisis, there wasn't much to you in the first place. Rescue the perishing; don't hesitate to step in and help.

If you say: "Hey, that's none of my business," will that get you off the hook?

Someone [the Lord Himself] is watching you closely, you know – Someone not impressed with weak excuses.' have a vision for planting a chapter and to see it grow,' he said. 'God is looking for standardbearers — and this calls for patient, brave prayers if we are to overcome the spirit of lethargy and indifference all around us. 'Sadly, some Christian men really never reach

'A man's own vision is a vital element — he must

out to those around them. Their restricted vision doesn't extend much beyond entertaining people at a monthly dinner club, but the Holy Spirit is calling us far beyond that narrow view.'

God's timing in a locality is also crucial in seeing a new chapter develop, adds Tom. 'You watch for that trigger-point – some indicator from the Lord: it could begin with an unexpected phone call from a man who asks you for copies of **Voice** magazine. 'That man, with encouragement from you, may well become the standard-bearer around whom a new chapter is formed.'
