God reinforces His Word to the Fellowship! Peter Spreckley - Chairman of the National Council

When God spoke the same message to us *twice*, we sat up and took notice. He said (as reported in the previous issue of Vision): "The latter glory of the Fellowship will be greater than the former."

That first message was exciting! **But now he has said it again.** This time it was to the Canadian National Convention, when he spoke exactly the same word through Alan O'Soup, a Canadian Indian, again, that "the latter glory will be greater than the former glory".

Alan powerfully unpacked the message from Haggai, chapter 2. CDs of his message have been sent to each Local Group President. Here, in summary, are the main points of the message, which we all need to heed:

- We must take our eyes off the natural, *i.e.* what we often see now, which may be *small* groups, *small* dinners and *small* conventions, and start to build by faith, because . . .
- God's covenant with Demos still stands, and the vision, the anointing on that vision and the calling are still the same. The vision was birthed in the Holy Spirit and in power.
- Thus, the Lord watches over His Word to perform it.
- God holds the Full Gospel Business Men responsible for carrying it out. It will not

happen on its own - it is up to us to be pro-active and to bring it about. Jesus said: "As long as it is day we must do the work . . . because the night is coming," (John 9:4). We must act *now* – and not look for excuses to put things off.

- We must "Be strong... and work," (verse 4). This is not the time to quit, or close down groups. Rather, we must take back that which the devil has stolen. It's time to go forward in faith and open new groups.
- For God says: "I am with you". (see Haggai 1: 6, 7). Yes, the Government of Heaven, the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit, and even the Angels are all on our side saying: "Go for it, we are with you."

Men, we urge you to listen to this CD message yourselves to receive its full impact, because there is much more to it than this brief summary. Make sure you hear it at your next Fellowship meeting - then ask yourself whether you want to be a part of this great move of God. And don't forget it all starts with his command to "consider your ways."

We must not miss this great opportunity and challenge.

- A spirit of poverty when God wants to fund and bless the work.
- A spirit of fear when we need to be fired up with boldness.

I was born south of the River Thames – "a Mouthy Southy" as they called those of us from south-east London. My father was a master printer and my mother a housewife. From the age of five, my sister and I were sent to Sunday school, though my parents didn't go to church. But it was there that I began to learn about the things of God.

However, at 21, I was "grown up", and, for various reasons, was initiated as a Freemason. By the age of 29 I was even installed as the youngest Worshipful Master of the Lodge – it seemed I had "arrived" as "doors were opened" to meet influential contacts. Though outwardly confident – I was able to carry out all the ritualistic ceremonies from memory – I struggled inwardly with high anxiety. I knew how it felt to walk into a room and have to immediately walk out. In time, I became hopelessly "hooked" on tranquillisers. Yet despite this, I moved on through the world of freemasonry, becoming a member of my electrical trade lodge, as well the president in the Royal Arch degree of freemasonry.

Then, one year, a cousin invited us to attend a family camping holiday during Downs Bible Week. We were unsure about going, but my cousin was praying hard – and we finally did go. After all, it was a relatively low-cost holiday.

So I packed my tranquillisers, my book on yoga meditation - and of course a Bible, since it was, after all, a Bible Camp!

For the first time we met people who had a personal relationship with Jesus. They seemed to know God. It was the first time we had heard people speaking in tongues - I thought they'd all learned Hebrew!

It was also the first time we had witnessed God's healing power at work. Suddenly, the gospel began to make sense: God is real and He is supernatural.

In simple faith, I went to my bedroom, knelt down and repented of my sins and asked

Jesus to come into my life and take control. Nothing outwardly dramatic happened - no blinding flash, but rather a reassurance that things were changing and that Jesus was alive and had heard my prayer.

Later, as I thumbed through a Christian magazine, I noticed that the Full Gospel Business Men's Fellowship International held monthly dinner meetings in many towns, and both men and women were very welcome to attend. Right then, I felt these meetings would be ideal for me.

They proved to be a great encouragement: And like Demos Shakarian who had said, years before: "I had started out on an adventure - an adventure with the Holy Spirit. And it keeps getting better!"

After many years of work in the news media, I am convinced today that the Bible is far more up-todate than tomorrow's headlines.

The Bible is timeless. And I'm honoured also to be an ambassador for the Good News of Jesus Christ. My adventures have taken me around the world. Nothing compares with the joy of sharing the gospel. Praise God for the FGBMFI, a ministry birthed by the Holy Spirit.

My wife, Lois, and I are blessed with a lovely family: four grownup children and eight grandchildren.

I came to Christ at the age of 17. Then in my 20's I began a career in journalism and publishing, but this took an unusual twist when I felt called to go to the nations with the gospel.

We drove overland to India where – in faith - we started a publishing programme with Operation Mobilisation that eventually produced more than 100 million pieces of literature in 12 languages.

In my early 30's I was asked by my OM friends to look for an oceangoing ship that would host training conferences and be a launching point for evangelism in many nations. The vessel we bought as renamed 'Logos' (meaning the Word), which carried more than 250 tons of literature and medical aid. I flew ahead, lining up the international outreach programme. Eventually, the ship visited ports around the world for 14 years. So far, the various OM ships have attracted more than 33 million visitors.

Returning to the UK with a young family, I resumed my career in journalism, moving from regional and evening and daily papers to the Financial Times in London - at a time when the FT was expanding rapidly into international editions. I also became founding editor of a regular review that introduced the business community to new technologies.

But as a Christian I've been a slow learner: it was years before I grasped the fact that God not only saves, but he also heals by the power of the Holy Spirit.

In the past decade I also came to better understand the Father heart of God and our call to walk in true sonship – a vital message for a world full of spiritual "orphans."

I especially thank God for the promise is Hebrews 7:25 that says "Jesus is able to save completely – to the uttermost – the one comes to God through him".

Yes, saved daily from "self" (perhaps our worst enemy?), so that we can know Him - and make Him known through word and deed.

Please dig a little deeper!!

The budget for 2007 is estimated to be £77,850 to run the Fellowship providing support to all members which includes copies of Voice, Vision and the running of the National Office in Knutsford.

The income to the end of November 2006 was £72,572 which means we trust God for the extra needed.

Cyprus begins to Bubble

John and Susan Wright were on a mission to Cyprus in November where they saw a similar move of God to the extraordinary and ongoing revival on the Costa del Sol in Spain.

They spoke at church and outreach meetings in Polis, Paphos, Limassol and Nicosia, helped by former FGB members Ken Beesley, Nick Jackson and Tony Davis. At a dinner for 80 at a Paphos Beach Hotel, ten people came forward for salvation, and 20 for the baptism with the Spirit.

In Limassol, a man who had had a leg injury for 12 years from football was healed. In Nicosia, after preaching at St Paul's Cathedral, the 15-year old grandson of an English couple who did a lot to arrange the meetings was born again, filled with the Spirit and the next day was confessing sins to his mother the fruit of repentance!

A talk on "God in Business" to 40 pastors and business men on the last night in Nicosia was very well received and 12 men expressed an interest in starting a Chapter there. A return visit will be necessary in the new year to start Chapters in Paphos, Limassol and Nicosia – God willing!

A fresh anointing and blessing has been experienced by FGB members from the North West Region as they have recently travelled to other countries.

People in greater numbers have been praying to accept Jesus as Lord and Saviour, there has been physical healing. In Poland, speaking at seven outreach events organised by the local churches in the Gorsow region, there were 63 people who came to Christ.

More than half of those attending were guests and over half of them responded to the message of salvation. As God brought healing, one elderly lady, called Barbara, who had been bent over, with crutches, stood up straight – and rejoiced. Her pain was gone! And with big smiles she thanked us for praying for her.

Yes, praise God: he is moving in power!

The event was full of surprises -Peter and Kevin had not expected to be the main speakers, leading five sessions each, plus testimonies at a Saturday night banquet, as well as praying for sick, personal evangelism and speaking at village churches

On one occasion they were they found themselves as "illegal immigrants" on Zanzibar island due to a mix-up over travel documents. But their tour guide, Eddy, was able to sort it out – and later they also



had the joy of leading him to Christ.

"At the village churches there was also such joy and light of Christ on Tanzanian faces," says Kevin. "The dancing and singing were awesome as they joyfully worshipped God with all of their hearts. Then the power of the Holy Spirit descended and we were simply bystanders as people wept and cried out to God.

"I told them if my brothers and sisters in England could experience what I saw they would call it revival! I felt so close to heaven as I joined in with the praise." On Sunday evening, Peter and Kevin hosted the officers and their wives at a dinner in their hotel. "We were able to share the challenges of running a successful FGB group.

"They, like us, are in a spiritual battle and it requires obedience and passion to win the day."

Kevin adds: "The Lord had given me a prophecy some months earlier at a Fellowship meeting. He said "Open your mouth and I will fill it." We did just that and watched in awe as he gave us the words for every situation."

Despite having spent eight years in Africa, our visit to Burkina Faso and Mali was quite a cultureshock!
